pig and dig

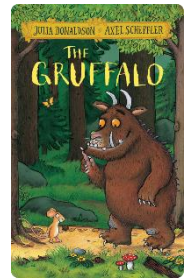


There are 3 activities for you to try, please don't feel that you need to complete all 3!

1. Find the odd one out on each row. Adults can help with the reading if needed!
2. Cut and stick the matching rhyming words
3. Cut out the pictures then put the rhyming words into their groups.

You could always read a rhyming book and ask your child to guess the rhyming word. Julia Donaldson books would be great.
