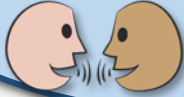


Let's check we know the value of all the coins...

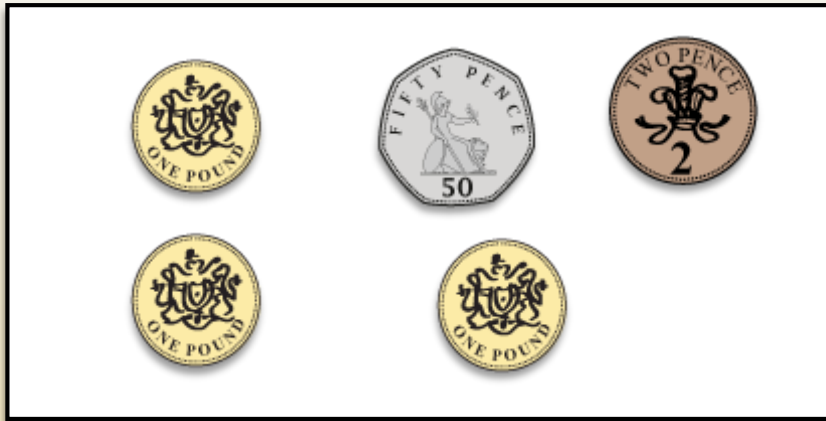
...starting with the greatest value.



How much money is here?



How can we write it?



£3.52

Pounds *before* the decimal place, pence *after*. The five is worth 50p and the two is worth 2p.

Three pounds and fifty two pence.

No need for a 'p' for the pence if we've already written a £.

Understand place value in money; Compare amounts of money written in pounds and pence.

£1	.	10p	1p
3	.	3	5
3	.	7	3

We can use this money place value grid to write amounts of money.

**£3.35** and **£3.73**  
Which is the **greater** amount?

The grid can help us decide which is greater.  
**Both have £3, so compare the 10ps.**

We can use 'crocodile' symbols **<** and **>** to show this.

**£3.35 < £3.73**

**£3.73 > £3.35**
