WALT: Use column addition to add 3-digit numbers.

Today we are going to recap how to add 3-digit numbers using a written method. We are going to practise using column addition including how to 'carry' or 'exchange' when needed. To do this, you need to label you H, T and O's column and write numbers in carefully. Remember to always start with the Ones column.

Activity 1:

Let's practise writing out column addition. Squared paper would be best for this, but otherwise use my grids below.

I have started the first one for you, then you need to write out the next questions yourself. With addition, it doesn't matter which number you write first. Add the Ones first, then the Tens, then the Hundreds.

1). $264 + 523 =$

H	T	O
2	6	4
5	2	3

2). $573 + 211 =$

H	T	O

3). $164 + 825 =$

H	T	O

Now let's practise questions where the ones cross the tens barrier. This means we will need to 'carry' the extra ten into the tens column. This is sometimes called exchanging. I have given you an example below.

1). $236 + 159 =$

H	T	O
2	3	6
1	5	9
3	8	5

For my Ones, I did $6 + 9 = 15$. 15 cannot fit into the Ones column, so I carried the 1 Ten under the Tens column, and left the 5 in the Ones.

When I added the Tens, I had to remember to add that extra Ten!

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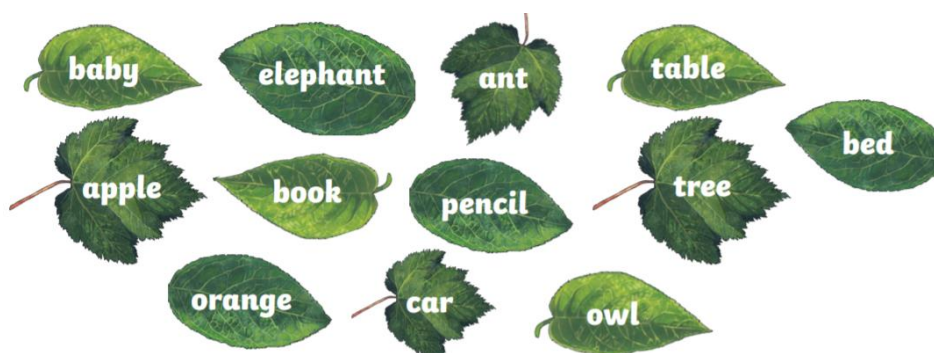
Magic Spell: A or An?

Today we will practise using 'a' or 'an' based on whether the next word begins with a consonant or a vowel. We use 'a' when the following word makes a consonant sound e.g. a rock. We use 'an' when the following word makes a vowel sound e.g. 'an open box'

Remember to listen for the sound the word makes. For example 'a unicorn'. 'Unicorn' makes the 'yuh' sound at the beginning, which is a constant, so we use 'a'.

Read the words below and decide if we use 'a' or 'an'. Write them out underneath.
