



This digraph is **th**. You need to make sure that you are sticking your tongue out and that you are not making a f sound instead.

Don't forget that **th** is one sound so th-i-n thin has 3 sounds

th-i-ck thick also has 3 sounds

Make sure that you are saying **thin**, not fin.

this, **that**, **with** and **then** are high frequency words which are words that we use a lot!.

Again, try to pronounce **th** so that you are saying **then** (not den), **moth**, (not mof) and **with** (not wiv). I know it's tricky.
