



Letters and Sounds

Today we are introducing the **ee** digraph which is usually a favourite and easier to remember!



Number

Continuing with the subtraction today.

I have made an Evil Pea worksheet. The children just need to take away the correct number of peas by squashing them (crossing them out) and then counting to find the number that are left. Again, they can say the number sentence for each one.



So for the first one, 5 take away/subtract 3 equals 2.

Reading/Expressive Art and Design

Today I would like you to make some of the characters from the story. Perhaps you could use a real potato and veggies (they don't have to be exactly the same as the story) or you could have a go at making your own.



I have included some characters to cut out if you would like to use them or you could draw them yourself.

There is also a Supertato cut and stick for those who would like something extra.

You are going to use your characters to tell the superhero story. You might be able to find some more props around the house – a potato masher, a box for the freezer etc.



Watch or read the story again to help to remember the main parts and then try to tell them in the right order (this doesn't need to be in great detail, just an outline). This is another VIPERS skill – sequencing.
