

## Letters and Sounds

You will find a roll and write sheet with **ur** words.




It works just like the roll and read sheets. You roll the dice. If you land on a 3 for instance, then you write curl in the curl row.

There isn't an Alphablocks episode specifically with **ur** words but this one has **oi**, **ar** and **ur** words.



## Maths – Number

There is a 3 Little Pigs I spy and count sheet. There are lots of things to count here so the children may need some support to make sure that they haven't counted things more than once. Maybe cross them out as you are counting.



If you still have a number line, you can use it to help to write the numbers.

## Understanding the World

Next week we will be thinking and then writing facts about real pigs - what they look like, what they eat, where they live, what the babies are called etc.



As a starting point, I would like the children to look at the picture of the pigs in the story and a real pig.

What can/do the pigs in the story do that real pigs can't? What is the difference?


They will hopefully tell you that in the story, the pigs wear clothes, look like they have legs and arms, build houses.

I would like the children to find a simple fact about a pig that they can remember for next week and share with the class. You can search online together. You don't need to write it down, but you can if it's tricky to remember.
