

**Transport**  
**Mrs Armitage**  
**on Wheels**

**PSHE:** We will be thinking about how to maintain physical, mental and emotional health and wellbeing.

**Geography:** We will be looking at similarities and differences between a place in the UK and a place abroad.

**English:** We will be looking at the Mrs Armitage stories and writing our own story about her. We will also be creating information sheets about different modes of transport. The children will also be increasing their spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG) knowledge through daily sessions focusing on one aspect. We will also be introducing cursive handwriting.

**Art/DT:** We will be designing, making and evaluating a cushion for Mrs Armitage's bicycle. The children will use a range of tools and joining techniques.

**Maths:** We will be working through the Year 2 objectives in a variety of ways including practical and written activities:

- Sequences and place value
- Number facts and counting
- Money and time
- Money, addition and subtraction
- Length, position and direction
- Sequences and fractions

**P.E:** We will be playing team games, building on ball skills. We will be learning a dance linked to our topic.

**ICT:** we will be programming different devices using simple algorithms. We will be using Word and its features.

**Science:** This term, we will be learning about animals, including humans. We will learn about how they are born, grow and change, and what we need to survive and be healthy. The children will classify different kinds of animal babies, learn about the basic needs that are shared by humans and animals, and research the differing needs of animals within our care.

**History:** We will be learning about the history of the bicycle and how it has changed over the years. We will also look at other forms of transport.

**R.E:** We will be learning how nature is important across all religions. We will revisit the Christian Creation story, learn about the importance of harvest to Christians and Jews by learning about harvest festivals and Sukkot. We will also listen to stories from Buddhism and Islam about the importance of looking after nature.

**Music:** We will be using the BBC School radio resource, *The Magic Hummingbird*. This will use the skills of singing, playing tuned/untuned musical instruments, rehearsing and performing.
